Footy and netball are finally back for 2022 and WorkSafe is proud to continue its decades' long partnership with AFL Vic Country.

Community sport continues to be vital to our health and wellbeing; an opportunity to connect with friends, family and team mates on and off the field or court. The competition and comradery of weekend sport unites us and gives us a sense of community.

And it is this sense of community that makes our partnership with footy and netball so valuable. It is our opportunity work alongside local clubs and leagues to promote workplace safety and appeal to rural and regional Victorians to look after their mates at work.

When our workers are safe, we'll see them on the field, on the court and on the sidelines. Doing what they love, together.

Safety on Farms

In country areas we know a large part of staying safe at work is staying safe on farms.

Yet tragically, too many workers are being killed or seriously injured on farms every year. In fact, 14% of workplace fatalities are in agriculture, despite farms accounting for just 2% of Victoria's workforce. As a community, we simply must do better. We owe it to those lost and to those left behind.

Farmers know their land, livestock and machinery better than anyone, but that doesn't make them bulletproof.

We know the "it'll be right" attitude that is common in agriculture can have deadly consequences. We also know that experienced farmers are suffering serious incidents, and that if safety is not a priority, experience alone isn't enough to prevent a tragedy from occurring.

Our 'It's never you, until it is' agriculture

campaign highlights that deaths and injuries on farms are preventable, not inevitable, and encourages farmers to treat safety improvements like any other improvement in their business. This campaign isn't about us telling farmers and those in the agriculture industry what to do, but reminding them that life changing incidents can and do happen.

You can prevent these incidents by making safety a priority. And you most certainly can prevent deaths. Our farmers are the lifeblood of our community and we need to support them in every way possible.

Together with our partners at AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria, WorkSafe will host six Country Club games this year throughout the state.

If we are in your area, come and see us, have a cuppa and help us encourage all farmers to rest during long hours on the land.

Fatigue isn't just about being tired, it's pushing your body beyond its limits, day after day. It impairs reaction times, concentration, and the ability to think clearly.

Wonthaggi Power v Leongatha

Rivalry round comes to Alinta Energy Gippsland League with matches spread across Saturday and Sunday. Wonthaggi Power and Leongatha headline Saturday action with bragging rights in South Gippsland up for grabs. The Power sit at the top of the A Grade ladder after big wins over Sale and Warragul in the first two rounds. The Power look like the real deal in 2022 and will be taking on one of the favorites in Leongatha who are also 2 from 2 to start the year. The Parrots will like their chances and with the likes of Taylah Brown and Hanah Flanders in form they have both ends of the court covered. The senior match is set to be another classic. Leongatha again look to be the team to beat after dismantling Sale away from home in round 2. Wonthaggi played out one of the most entertaining draws in recent memory against Warragul with both sides finishing on 106 points a piece. The points between these two sides were split last season and their matches this year will be vital to the final make up of the five. Tom Marriott and Cade Maskell were in top form in Round 2 and with Jack Hume and Aaron Hillberg getting plenty of supply they look capable of kicking a winning score. Wonthaggi will need to lock down the Parrots big bodied midfield if they are to get the win.

Bairnsdale v Sale

East Gippsland honors are on the line with Bairnsdale hosting Sale on Saturday. The Red Legs will be backing up against another Eastern rival after their round 2 matches against Maffra. Both sides come away empty handed from the trip and will be eager to try and get the first win on the board. The A Grade match will be intriguing with both young sides on the rebuild it is one of the few chances they will get to come away with a win in 2022. Sale have come of back to back heavy defeats against the South Gippsland sides who should both feature in finals action while Bairnsdale were beaten by premiership favorites Morwell in Round 1. A toss of the coin game which will have plenty to play for. The senior Red Legs are coming off two disappointing losses. They were in the game for large parts against Maffra leading in the first half and controlling the last quarter however they leaked goals which led to a comfortable defeat. Sale have faced the premiership favorites in both matches and their round 2 result was unexpected being beaten by 11 goals at home to Leongatha after a strong start. They will need to sort out the forward line and their ball usage which was well below Gippsland League par in round 2. Sale will want to win and win comfortably to get their season started.

Moe v Maffra

Maffra make the trip to Ted Summerton Reserve in the final of the Saturday matches. The two senior sides side 1 & 2 on the ladder and have built up a competitive rivalry over the past few seasons. The Lions stamped their premiership credentials in 2021 at Maffra with a big win and will be hoping they can do the same at home. The Eagles still have an elite core group of players and the first two rounds have showed what they are capable of. This will be their first big test of the year and

it will be interesting to see the contrast between youth and experience play out. Moe will be slight favorites at home and will rely on their young stars Riley Baldi, Brock Smith and Harry Pepper who is coming off back to back 5 goal games. Moe's A Grade side are coming off a defeat in a high class round 2 match against fellow premiers favorites Morwell. The Lions have talent across the court and will be hard to beat especially for a travelling Maffra side. The Eagles managed to take care of business against Bairnsdale to get some positive form going into the match.

Warragul v Drouin

The Western Derby will feature on Sunday with traditional rivals Warragul and Drouin set to renew their hostilities on the field and courts. Warragul go into the match after a memorable draw with Wonthaggi Power which will give them plenty of confidence that their gameplan stacks up against the best. The young Hawks are coming off two heavy defeats and will not be keen on the prospect of facing a team with Jed Lamb and Brayden Fowler in the forward half. The Gulls should win the match and will need to if they have ambitions of pushing towards that hotly contested finals spot. Drouin A Grade look to be one of the big improvers in 2022 and they will get another chance to prove that on Sunday. The Hawks sit 2 from 2 with wins over Traralgon and Maffra. Warragul will be disappointed to be winless however have faced off against two of the anticipated top sides for this year. April Bethune and Kym Diston have been excellent for Drouin and will look to shut down the Gulls shooters while the battle between Renee Cook and Stacie Gardiner may just decide the result for either team.

Traralgon v Morwell

The final match of the round is the AFL Victoria



Worksafe Game of the Month between Traralgon and Morwell. The match was originally scheduled for Saturday night however the Council has still not been able to supply the necessary utilities for Traralgon to utilize their home venue. The Maroons had a huge win over Drouin in the football with Brett Eddy kicking 10 goals in the victory. There would have been some heavy discussions in the Tigers match committee on how to combat the Traralgon forward line. Morwell started positively against Moe with the Tigers sticking in the game in the second term but were blown away in the last half. Nathan Noblett and Tristen Waack were shining lights for the Tigers last week and will be heavily relied on again. Traralgon should get the points over the four quarters but the rivalry between these two Gippsland League clubs will undeniably throw in a few curveballs during the day. The rivalry extends to the netball courts with the 2019 Grand Final rematch taking place. The Maroons are a different looking team from that match and the Tigers will also feature new stars. Morwell were classy and tough against the Lions in Round 2 and their defense looks as strong as any Gippsland League side in recent history. The Tigers should be too good but as with the football rivalry expect anything to happen on the day.

Bairnsdale pulled off the first big upset of the season when they were far too strong for Traralgon. The Redlegs played in front of a huge local crowd under their newly installed lights, the game in the balance at half time. After the break Bairnsdale kicked twelve goals to the Maroons' two, eight players sharing the goalkicking honours for the winners. Warragul matched Bairnsdale's feat by winning a heart-stopping match against powerhouse Maffra. The Eagles led early, but it was the third term where Warragul kept them goalless where the fortunes of the match swung the Gulls' way. Ben Drew was the hero of the day with the winning goal just seconds from the final siren. Wonthaggi beat Moe to keep the Lions winless for the year to date. Leongatha got an early break on Morwell and were never troubled after that, while Sale's backline kept Drouin goalless until the final quarter, coach Matthew Ferguson adding another six goals to bring his season's tally to 23, ten ahead of the next best.

The Maroons were still in the hunt at the start of the final quarter before the Blues rattled on eight goals to five, winning by 44 points. Emile Studham was best for the Blues, Tom Wells and Warren Everitt providing targets up forward with four goals each. Powerhouse forward Paul McCulloch was best for the Maroons with his bag of seven majors. Moe thrashed Sale by exactly 100 points, with onballer Brett Membrey best afield. A multi-pronged forward line saw seven multiple goalkickers. Morwell was competitive early against Leongatha before the Parrots drew away after half time. Craig McCaughan was best for Leongatha who had Adrian Campbell (4 goals) as a focal target. Maffra had the bye.

Traralgon, with Geoff Hocking dominating the ruck, and Jim Stevenson (6 goals) on fire around the packs, overcame a 16 point half time deficit to kick twelve second half goals to win over Sale by 49 points. Leongatha led by five goals at half time in their game against

Warragul, then put the issue beyond doubt when they slammed home nine goals in the third term. Moe kicked a cricket score against Churchill. The Lions' total of 37.28.250 remains to this day the club's highest ever score. Ken Rainsford (11), Brett Szabo (10) and Ashley Robinson (5) led the spree, Moe kicking 10.6 in the first term and 13.6 in the third, both also club records for those quarters. Maffra was too strong for Bairnsdale, strangling the Redlegs to the tune of a half time scoreline of 1.3.9, then sealing the deal with thirteen second half goals. Recruit Craig Kernick started up forward for the Eagles with six goals.

40 YEARS AGO 17th April 1982

Inaccuracy cost Yallourn/Yallourn North any chance that it had of causing an upset against Traralgon. As the teams went in to their three quarter time huddles both had twenty scoring shots on the board, yet Traralgon (12.8) led the Blues (5.15) by 35 points. Coach Peter Hall and Rick Hoeben led the way for the Maroons. It took a six goal to four final term to separate Bairnsdale and Morwell, Bairnsdale taking a two point lead to a three goal win. Sale was too good for a determined Newborough, David Mason and Richard Coulthard (6 goals) leading the Magpies to a 65 point win. Leongatha remained on top of the ladder but was made to work to the final siren in beating Warragul by fifteen points, Colin Boyd (Leongatha) and Steve Hodge(Warragul) were their sides' best players. Moe won against Maffra by 26 points, but the story of the game was the amazing accuracy of the Eagles who recorded 15.2.92, twelve straight goals after quarter time. Peter Neville kicked 12 of their 15 goals. Steve Weadley was the dominant onballer for Moe.

Morwell came within a straight kick of upsetting Moe, the Lions having to come from behind in the final quarter to overrun the Tigers. Len Staff and Steve Janeczek led Moe's recovery as they stormed home with five goals to two in the final term. Maffra and Heyfield had a tight battle until halftime, when the Kangaroos led by eight points. The third term was all Maffra as they kicked seven goals to one to set up their win. Likewise with Bairnsdale, the Redlegs kicked away in the final term against Leongatha. The Parrots did their cause no favours in the final term when they managed just six behinds. John Callery and David Overy were named as Bairnsdale's best players. Trevor Somerville led Sale to victory against Warragul, a narrow three point lead stretched to just eight points at the final siren. Traralgon and Yallourn had a close battle, the Maroons maintaining a nine point three quarter time lead. Ken Ludlow (Traralgon) and Ian Cooper (Yallourn) were named as best.
