Maffra v Sale

Round 4 is here and the first full month of football and netball is about to be completed. It's another enticing schedule of fixtures as rivalry round spills over into round 4 with one of the traditional foes Maffra and Sale set for the 2022 Battle of the Birds. Sale go into the senior football match after their first win of the season over fellow East Gippslander's Bairnsdale. The Magpies have started slowly and this shapes as an early indicator to where they are at for season 2022. The Eagles will be awaiting the availability of their star Ed Carr who was reported against Moe. Carr has been in great form and forms as a vital player to the result of the match. After two big scores the Eagles were held to only 3 goals against Moe. In accuracy had a large bearing on this kicking 14 points in the loss. They have the advantage of noted goalkickers in Bedggood & Bennett while Sale are relying heavily on goals from midfielders like Shannen Lange & Jack Johnstone with the Dessent brothers missing from the team. Sale will be slight favorites but the Battle of the Birds could produce anything. The A Grade match will see two sides that will look at the fixture and see one of the few chances to get 4 points in season 2022. The Eagles are the stronger team and have some of their quality juniors stepping into senior netball. Both sides have managed a win so far beating the young Bairnsdale team. Tegan Harrison has fitted in nicely in the front court for Sale and managed 30 goals last week in a team that has only shot 83 goals for the entire season. Nat Allman and Emma Allman have been productive through the mid court for Maffra and will have a large part in the result this Saturday.

Moe v Traralgon

It's been over 1000 days coming but Latrobe Valley rivals Moe and Traralgon finally get a chance to meet again. The clubs were set to play four times in season 2021 before the abandonment of the season. Moe go into the match on top of the ladder after three convincing wins in the first 3 weeks. The Lions accounted for the unbeaten Maffra side last week and look set to be a top 3 side again this year. Harry Pepper has kicked 13 goals in the first 3 weeks and with fellow 2019 AFL draftee Brock Smith controlling half back the pair have made up for the loss of some of the Melbourne based players from 2021. Traralgon started slowly against Morwell in the ANZAC clash but pulled away to get the win by 48 points. The Maroons moved the ball slickly and have some key targets up forward with Brett Eddy, Dylan Loprese and Jake Best. Their defence looked vulnerable at times when Tye Hourigan was forced into the ruck. Hourigan was best on field nudging out Mark Collison who was a ball magnet and did whatever he please after quarter time. An interesting game for two sides that will see themselves as top 5 contenders in 2022. The Lions may be slight favorites at home but Traralgon can play a burst of football that wins any game. In the A Grade match there are high stakes for different reasons then these two sides are accustomed. The Maroons have started the season 0-3 but are far from a 9th placed team. A tough draw and 3 close losses see them only sit above Bairnsdale and come up against one of the top sides this year. Moe have won their two games convincingly over Maffra and Warragul. They were without Taylin Gourley last week but managed to get the points by 25 goals over the Eagles. The match will be won in Traralgon's goal ring. Maddy Stockdale was one of their better players against Morwell and will need to fire to help them shoot a winning score.

Wonthaggi v Drouin

Wonthaggi travel to Drouin after losses in both their major football and netball grades last weekend. The Power fell short against the Parrots on the netball court after their amazing start to the season. The Hawks and the Power will be locked in battle for that 4th or 5th spot in A Grade come seasons end and these matches effectively take on an 8 point bounty for the winner. Drouin will be kicking themselves they fell short against Warragul which places more emphasis on this

result. Kym Diston again was solid in defence while Stacie Gardiner shot 24 goals in the loss. The Power will need Zali Anderson's availability again to play a key role in defence against the Proctor sisters. Wonthaggi's shooters will need to get the supply they lacked at times against Leongatha if they are to come away with the win at Drouin. Every season there is a result that makes the Gippsland League footy community take notice and the Hawks produced that last week. It wasn't the win over their traditional rivals but the margin and score that made people take notice. Jordan Kingi should be incredibly proud of the way they bounced back after a home thumping against Traralgon. Having Ed Morris available certainly helps as the 2019 number 1 ranked Gippsland League player was named best on field in his return. The Power fell short against Leongatha at home but it was in a very high standard of football. They had a number of chances but didn't convert where their opponents were ruthless in their execution inside 50. The Power have a big forward line and this will stretch Drouin. They need to start putting the results on the board though with only 6 points from their first 3 rounds they need to get the job done against teams that will likely finish outside the 5.

Morwell v Warragul

Contrasting results for both sides in their respective codes last week give different meaning to the matches for Morwell and Warragul. Both A Grade sides had great wins over their rivals in round 3 which sets up a key clash this weekend. Morwell look like premiership favorites this year and have beaten both Moe and Traralgon already. They were down at times in round 3 but have arguably the best depth on every line in the

League which gave them the backing to get the job done in the final quarter. At home it is tough to see the Gulls getting enough shots up to put in a winning score with Courtney Garth relishing the goal keeper role this year. Morwell blew Traralgon away early last week but fell away after half time as they did against Moe. The young Tiger's attack and take the game on but are finding it hard to get structured quality looks on goal over four quarters. They are getting enough of the ball but in the last few weeks have been forced to take long sets shots which hasn't managed to yield the results after their initial energy drops away. After a huge result against Wonthaggi, Warragul would have panned in four points against the Hawks but managed just the three goals. We praised their forward strength last week and they will be hoping it is only a minor glitch on their 2022 radar. Nick Graham was back and better for the run while Sean Masterson is having a team of the year season already across half back. Warragul should bounce back and win but expect Morwell to be in front at half time.

Bairnsdale v Leongatha

Bairnsdale make the trip to Leongatha in what is the toughest test in football. The Parrots dynasty continues and they look set to feature late in September again. The Red Legs have not been competitive in this trip in the past and it looks like a familiar case for them even in round 4. They will take heart from the Drouin results and look to the 2019 result where the 10th placed Gulls beat the Parrots at home. Tom Marriott and Luke Bowman are arguably the two most valuable players in the competition in the Leongatha midfield. They are winning huge numbers and start the majority of scores from clearances. Cade Maskell behind the ball has been inspired and the floating defender is being a huge influence with his disposal out of full back and leadership in the back 6. The netball is a similar case unfortunately for Bairnsdale. They missed their two best chances in the first half of the year at a win in the last two weeks and now face the top of the table Parrots. They were clinical against Wonthaggi and have a number of experienced players on each line. Nicola Marriott and Taylah Brown made up the best offensive mid court in the competition and with Hannah Flanders and Jess Edgar there to feed the ball into they will be far too strong for the young Red Legs.

5 YEARS AGO 6th May 2017

Incredible accuracy by Traralgon in registering 15.3.93 against fellow unbeaten team Leongatha saw them rise to the top of the Gippsland League ladder. The Maroons, led by Mark Collison and Jay Neagle, broke the game open in the third term where they added six goals to one. The upset of the day was the great win by Warragul (8th after Round 3) over top placed Maffra. Nate Paredes and ruckman Jake Horstman controlled the battle of the midfield as the Gulls' strong first half set up the win. Wonthaggi took some time to shake off Bairnsdale, Kane McCarthy named as best for the Power. Moe had 46 scoring shots against Drouin, Tyson Biffin best for the Lions with Darnell Grech on target with six goals. Morwell won comfortably against Sale with Hayden Britten (4 goals) and Jack McLindin (6) their respective team's top scorers.

Dan McKenna's six goals led Traralgon to a big win over Moe, Lee Stockdale the best for the Maroons. Bairnsdale won at Morwell, with Mark Sellings and Nathan Storer both scoring five goals. Drouin came from two points down at the final break on Sunday against Warragul to storm home with a seven goal final quarter. Ben Hughes, now with Drouin, kicked seven goals for the Gulls.

Traralgon and Morwell played a closely fought first half with the Maroons taking a narrow lead. Russell Rowe and Greg Morley led the third quarter charge as Traralgon set up their win with a six goal quarter. Sale had the bye.

Alan Lowe and Peter Henderson provided great targets up forward for the winners. Warragul almost kicked its way out of a win against Moe when they registered a final score of 11.24.90. Alan Ross and Rob Ballingall dominated at the stoppages for Warragul, with big Steve Weadley named as best for the Lions. Tony Lane played a classic game for Traralgon, best afield and six goals to his credit, as the Maroons beat Bairnsdale by fifty points. Leongatha led Newborough by fifty points at half time. To their credit the Bulldogs won the second half , slightly reducing the final margin. Peter Sutherland and Chris West, with five goals apiece, were too strong for the Newborough defence. Ray Sweeney put on a goalkicking exhibition with nine goals against Maffra, the Blues winning by 48 points.

Trailing by two points at half time, Morwell kicked six straight goals to have an impressive 15.2.92 on the board, gaining them the match-winning break. Greg May and Steve Szabo were best for Morwell, May kicking four goals. Sale was best served by Rob Foster and Brian Cashman. Ian "Cocky" Banner kicked six goals for Maffra, whose big first half set them up for their win over Yallourn. The Blues made a late charge with a six goal final quarter, but couldn't make up the leeway. Robin "Buck" Moncur was best for the Blues. Robert "Jock" Welsh kicked six goals for the Blues. A nine goal third term broke what a lineball game against Heyfield. Score had been level at quarter time and Heyfield had led by a point at the half time break. Steve Janeczek (Moe) and Charlie Wojinski (Heyfield) were named as best, with Trevor Burke a standout in front of goals for the Kangaroos with nine goals. It was a thriller at Bairnsdale where Traralgon won by a solitary point, the scores having been equal at the final change of ends. Ken McQuatter led the way for Traralgon, with Ian White best for the Redlegs, Ray Watts kicking five goals. Warragul set the tone for its match against Leongatha with 8.4 to 1.1 at quarter time on their way to what was at the time a club record score for the Gulls in matches against Leongatha. Bob Baldry (7 goals), Ross Herbert (6) and John Morrison (4) proved too much for the Parrot defenders.
