MENTAL HEALTH ROUND



The Alinta Energy Gippsland League will be hosting a mental health awareness themed round on July 9th for round 13 of the 2022 season. This special theme round is proudly supported by our major partner Loy Yang B and will aim to help raise awareness of mental health issues and the impact it is having on our community and the quest to 'making better mental health our goal'.

The event will be run over the 5 match days with the Traralgon v Moe match being the feature matchday of the round. Both football and netball will be engaged with activities on the day. The main activation in the round will see one mental health champion from each football team across the four grades wear a specially designed jumper featuring a blue 0 on the back to represent the push for zero lives lost to mental health. These jumpers represent the League and member clubs' united position to support better mental health across our clubs and communities. In each netball match a mental health champion from each team will wear a special blue bib. Each netball match will also feature the use of a special blue netball match ball. All football and netball players and officials will be wearing blue arm bands to support the quest to make better mental health our goal.

Each of the five matchdays across the Gippsland League will participate for a Mental Health Round Cup. The winning club will receive this at the end of the day. The winning club will be based on the total team wins on the day across football and netball. In the result of a tie, the club with the highest average winning margin on the day will be declared the winner.

All 10 matches at each venue will have a medal to be awarded to the Alliance Player of the Game. This medal will be decided by the winning sides coaching panel and is awarded to the player they believe demonstrated the most courage, determination and teamwork for the winning side.

The League will be producing a special copy of the Gippsland League Record for the round and the match between Traralgon and Moe senior match and A Grade match will be streamed live via Gippsland League TV.

Summary of mental health round activations:

- Each of the five matchdays will compete for a Mental Health Round Cup
- Each match in Round 13 will have a player awarded the Alliance Medal for the best display of courage, determination and teamwork for that matches winning side.
- In every senior match in Round 13 a nominated champion will wear a specially designed jumper.
- In every netball match a nominated champion will wear a set of blue bibs
- In every netball match a special blue match ball will be used
- Football and netball players and officials will be asked to wear blue arm bands in the support of better mental health.
- Gippsland League will use the Record to feature an all-blue cover with an image of the champions in the jerseys to be worn on the match day.
- Traralgon v Moe Senior & A Grade match will be live streamed via Gippsland League TV

5 YEARS AGO 15th July 2017

Drouin almost caused the upset of the season with what would have been their first win when they led top four side Moe by 39 points late in the third quarter. Moe scored the last goal of that term and came home with six unanswered goals to steal an eight point win. Michael Theodoridis kicked five goals for the Hawks who were led by on-ball duo Liam Axford and champion ruckman Bob McCallum. For Moe James DeVirgilio and Tom Long were named as their best. Leongatha and Traralgon ground out a hard fought match where just thirteen goals were kicked, the Parrots victors by nine points. Luke Bowman (Leongatha) and Darren White (Traralgon) best for their teams. Maffra, with Darren Sheen in top form with seven goals, were too strong for Warragul. Wonthaggi had to fight to the siren against Bairnsdale and Sale took until the final term to shake off Morwell.

10 YEARS AGO 14th July 2012

In their 83rd meeting, Bairnsdale and Morwell drew for the first time when Robert Michaelides kicked truly from forty metres out after the final siren. The draw saw the Tigers slip two points behind Maffra (3rd). Match of the day was between second placed Leongatha and Maffra, both kicking four goals in the opening term. The Parrots kicked away, winning the next two quarters and seemed safe with a comfortable 36 point lead at the final break. Maffra, with midfielders Kel Porter and Hayden Burgiel leading the way, came hard at Leongatha in the final term with four goals to one, but the home side, with Chris Verboon (4 goals) named as their best, hung on to win and go three games ahead of the Eagles. Traralgon kicked eight third quarter goals to put Moe out of the picture, while it was an eight goal first quarter which set Sale on its way to a big win over Wonthaggi. On the Sunday Drouin jumped Warragul with a six goal to one first quarter, but Warragul pegged back the deficit, hitting the front in the final term, winning by three points. Gippsland Power player Tom Muir and the experienced Matt Gray were named as the Gulls' best, Cam DeGooyer best for the Hawks.

In icy cold and wet conditions Morwell broke through for its first win of the season in a low scoring, hard fought match against Sale. All of Sale's three goals for the match came in the first quarter, the Magpies restricted to just two behinds after that. Brad Knowles led the Tigers' charge as they fought their way to a three quarter time lead, then iced the game with another three goals. Maffra had its game against Traralgon in the bag at half time when they kept the Maroons to a single goal and led by 53 points. Justin Bramich was a tower of strength up forward for the Eagles. On Sunday at Wonthaggi errant kicking for goal was the order of the day as the teams combined for a total of 15 goals 32 behinds, the Blues winning but almost kicking it away.

Morwell went on to win by 87 points, Mark Waller impassable at half back, Ashley Bond dominant in the ruck and youngster Dean Caldwell kicking six goals. Traralgon remained atop the LVFL ladder with a strong win over Bairnsdale, although it took them a half to find

their top gear. The Maroons, with great games from Max Cunico and Russell Northe, led the Redlegs by just 16 points at half time, then added fourteen goals in the second half. Moe, led by Shane Jarvis, Darren O'Donnell and eight goals from Ken Rainsford, beat Maffra by ten straight goals to keep their slight chance of making the Four alive. Warragul peppered the goals against Churchill to win by 63 points, Nick Byrne and Trent Hotton named as their best with Darren Gahan kicking five majors.

Big wins resulted on the first weekend as Leongatha overpowered Newborough and Yallourn/Yallourn North proved too strong for Maffra. Peter Collins and Paul Heppell combined for ten of the Parrots' 24 goals against Newborough, with Collins and Brian Salmon named as best. Kevin Hay and Phil Bechaz did likewise for the Blues against Maffra. The second week saw shock results with Sale beating Morwell and Bairnsdale having a big win over Traralgon. Sale and Morwell were locked together at half time, Sale coming out after the break and adding six unanswered goals to claim the match. Bairnsdale led by two goals over Traralgon going in to the final quarter, then kicked six goals to one, Russell White and Murray Frew kicking five goals each, Trevor Fletcher best afield. Michael Vick and Rob Ballingall led Warragul to an important win against Moe, the win seeing the Gulls entrenched in the top three with a two game buffer to their credit. Vick capped his best afield game with four goals.

Just two wins separated top placed Moe from fifth placed Maffra after Round 13 matches were completed. Moe asserted themselves with a 75 point win over Heyfield, Dennis Stevens and Steve Janeczek leading the way, star full forward Ian Jennings kicking six goals to take him to a 20 goal lead in the league goalkicking list. A fifteen goal first half saw Traralgon in charge against Bairnsdale, the Maroons going on to win by over one hundred points. Gray "Fluffy" Malone was best for the Maroons with Graham Hore kicking eight goals. Sale scored an important win over Morwell to retain second place on the ladder, the Magpies skipping away after half time. Robert Foster was best for Sale with Terry Wynd kicking five goals. Lester Merlo and Doug Patterson led Maffra to a 43 point win over Yallourn, while Leongatha captain-coach Terry Benton was best in the Sunday slug against Warragul where just nine goals were kicked for the match.

What to do when you feel overwhelmed by life pressures



What is stress?

When faced with a challenging situation or stressful event, our bodies respond by activating the nervous system and releasing hormones including cortisol and adrenalin.

These hormones bring about certain physical changes in the body, helping us to react appropriately and deal with the challenge presented. However, if the stress is ongoing and the physical changes do not subside, we may feel overwhelmed and unable to cope.

Life pressures that can cause us to feel overwhelmed and stressed include:

- Relationship difficulties
- Family breakdown
- Illness or injury
- Work pressures or job loss
- Bullying and harassment
- Traumatic events
- Death of a loved one - including pets
- Financial difficulties
- Homelessness
- Lack of support and isolation

What are the signs of stress?

Below are some of the signs which indicate our stress levels are unhealthy:

- Feeling overwhelmed and unable to cope
- Feeling hyperalert and anxious
- Difficulty sleeping
- Changes in appetite
- Headaches and muscle tension
- Upset stomach
- Irritability
- Difficulty concentrating
- Changes in mood
- Fatigue and exhaustion
- Withdrawing from friends and family
- Thoughts of suicide
- Reliance on alcohol or other substances to cope

People respond differently to stressful situations.

Responses to stress will be determined by the situation faced, past experiences, personality, social support, access to resources and cultural background. What one person finds stressful, another may be more easily able to cope with.

Knowing yourself and how you respond to different situations is important as you can then learn to manage stress and seek help when necessary.

What to do when feeling overwhelmed?

Below are some practical strategies for managing stress when feeling overwhelmed by life pressures:

- **Identify the cause of your stress** – write down what is contributing to you feeling overwhelmed and stressed. You may identify one particular issue or have a range of things contributing to how you feel at this time. Prioritise the issues and leave smaller issues to be dealt with at a later time.
- **Review your current coping mechanisms** – identify how you have been coping to date. What tools and strategies have you found helpful? What things are you doing that are not helpful? Make any necessary changes to increase your ability to cope.
- **Talk to a trusted friend or family member** – talking through your issues with someone you trust can assist you to work through the issue and identify possible solutions.
- **Check your thinking** – often we put pressure on ourselves to be a certain way. Our thoughts directly impact our emotional state and can influence our behaviour. When our thoughts are negative and self-critical we may begin to feel overwhelmed. Instead of doing the things we need to do in order to deal with the stressful situation, we may in fact do things that are unhelpful.

“What does it mean to be suicidal?”

Feeling suicidal? You are not alone ... every year approximately 400,000 Australians experience suicidal thoughts¹, 62,000 make suicide attempts², 35,000 are admitted to hospital for suicide-related injuries³ and over 3,000 die from suicide⁴. But help is available.



Reasons for suicide

The reasons why people think about suicide are varied and personal. Often, it is because of a combination of factors related to their feelings or thoughts, or they may have recently experienced a 'triggering' event.

People thinking about suicide may feel:

- like suicide is their only way out
- alone, isolated and disconnected from the world around them
- helpless
- an unbearable amount of pain
- that no one understands them or that they are a burden
- that nothing will change to improve their situation.

Some 'triggering' events that may cause someone to consider suicide include:

- relationship break downs
- recent loss (a loved one, job, relationship, pet or public figure)
- family problems
- physical illness or injury
- sexual, physical or emotional abuse
- drug or alcohol problems
- mental illness, including schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and depression
- eating disorders
- school, uni or work problems
- unemployment or being unemployed for a long time
- feeling like they don't belong anywhere
- financial or legal problems
- major disappointments
- change in circumstances (retirement, separation, children leaving home).

Warning signs

Almost everyone who takes their own life gives some clue or warning. Never ignore talking about suicide. Take people's suicidal thoughts and feelings very seriously and help them find effective help. If you suspect that someone may have suicidal thoughts, ask them. This will give them permission to talk about it. Asking about suicidal thinking does not precipitate suicidal action.

There are a number of warning signs that a person might be thinking about suicide. Some of these include:

- discussions surrounding suicide, even if it seems to be a joke
- being moody, withdrawn or sad (Note: a sudden positive mood can also be a bad sign as it may mean a person has made up their mind to suicide)
- losing interest in things they previously enjoyed
- taking less care of their appearance
- anxiety or agitation, including difficulty concentrating or sleeping
- engaging in self-destructive or risky behaviour
- increased use of alcohol or drugs
- previous suicide attempts
- giving possessions away and saying goodbye
- gaining access to a means of ending their life
- unusual behaviour, including a happy disposition.

LAMB'S PERFECT 10

Warragul star Jed Lamb bagged 10 goals in his sides win over Drouin in Round 12. Lamb has been a focal point for the Gulls up forward this season and leads the JC Lawless Award for the senior goalkicking with 45 goals so far despite his side sitting in 8th place on the ladder. Aside from Challenge Cups etc from over a century ago Drouin and Warragul have met in organised competitions in the old Central Gippsland Football League up until 1940, then in two incarnations in this league (1960 to 1964 in the LVFL and 2005 to the present), also in the West Gippsland Football League between 2000 and 2004.

In the Gippsland League Lamb's 10 goals in Round 12 is a record for a Warragul player in matches against West Gippsland rival Drouin, beating the old record of 7 by Ben Hughes that was set in 2012.

In all matches in all Leagues' that Warragul has competed in, it is the most by a Warragul player against Drouin since Hayden Smart kicked 10 for Warragul against the Hawks in 2000 in the West Gippsland FL.

In the old Central Gippsland FL, Alan Fields kicked 10 for the Gulls against Drouin in 1938. Jack Reynolds also booted 10 for the Gulls against the Hawks in 1934 and 14 against them in 1935.

Horrie Farmer holds the all-time record for Warragul for goals in a match against Drouin with his haul of 18 goals in 1937.

Lamb managed to break another record earlier in 2022 when he kicked all 6 of his sides goals against Leongatha in Round 6. He is the first player in Gippsland League history to achieve the feat of kicking all 6 of his teams total of 6 goals before.
