Playing in his first senior Gippsland League Grand Final, Drew transferred to the Parrots in 2021 after playing his junior career at Warragul and in Gippsland Power. A senior Gippsland League Interleague representative in 2019. Another prime moving midfielder, Drew has put on size and was a dominant player in the second semi final win with 27 disposals.



Cade Maskell

Two time Premiership Parrot, Maskell has moved down back in 2022 with great effect. Missed games through the middle of the season but has bounced back to again be one of the Leongatha's best. A thumping left boot and can take a pack mark with the best of them. Look for him used frequently out of the defensive 50 today.

Maffra 2019 premiership player is now leading Sale to their first Grand Final since 2013. Johnstone has been huge in all three finals and was a clear best a field in the Preliminary Final. Tough with a touch of class, the way Leongatha try to contain him will go along way to deciding the match.



Shannen Lange

How can you go past the 2021 & 2022 League Most Valuable Player. After a decorated VFL career, Lange has pushed Sale to the next level which sees them competing in the Grand Final today. The best two players in the League will eye off at the center bounce with Lange going head to head with Tom Marriott. Expect to see him burst out of the clearances and rack up the football.



Ryan Pendlebury

A key addition to the backline in 2022. Fresh off a string of EFL honors, Pendlebury has provided a lot of class in the back 50. They use his left boot as a weapon going long and direct to the likes of Dessent and Leslie. Could be a big weekend for the Pendlebury's with both sets of Magpies in massive finals matches.



Jack Leslie

When you see Jack Leslie play you instantly think superstar of the game. Former Gold Coast Suns player, Leslie has been one of the competitions best since returning to the Gippsland League. Used in the ruck predominantly, he patrols the ground with a huge presence. Expect to see him take a few grabs today and launch the ball forward for the Magpies. If he can also hut the scoreboard they will be hard to beat.

5 YEARS AGO 23rd September 2017

What a match this was ! Eight lead changes throughout the match and five other times that the scores were locked together tells the story of the 2017 Grand Final. The first fifteen minutes was tight, Chris Dunne getting the first goals of the day, only to see Maffra's Darren Sheen answer twice at the 9 and 13 minute marks. Dunne scored again two minutes later, sparking a run of six goals by Leongatha in eleven minutes, taking them to a 24-point quarter time lead. Dylan Alexander scored the first goal of the second quarter for Maffra; Dunne (his 4th) and Davidson answered for Leongatha, who took a match-high 30-point lead at the 10 minute mark. Maffra then set about chipping away at the deficit, scoring goals through Dan O'Brien, Sheen, Mitch Bennett and Alexander, seeing the Eagles just 7 points adrift at the half way mark. The teams traded goals in the third quarter until Daniel Bedgood's goal at the 21 minute mark gained Maffra the lead. Josh Schelling regained the ascendancy for Leongatha, before a run of behinds (including two that hit the goalpost) saw Maffra ahead by two points with a quarter to go. Chris Dunne kicked a tight angle goal to put the Parrots back in front before goals to Kade Renooy and Sheen regained the lead for Maffra. Jack Ginnane (Leongatha) marked and goaled from 40 metres – Sheen kicked his 5th for Maffra to break the deadlock. Dunne kicked another tight-angled set shot truly for his 6th goal and the Parrots were two points ahead. Maffra had one last chance, but a behind was all that eventuated, the siren sounding shortly after with Leongatha a point ahead. Dunne's six goal haul afforded him best on ground honours for Leongatha, along with great work from Hayden Browne and Ben Chalmers, while for Maffra Darren Sheen, Kel Porter and Jack Johnstone were their best.

10 YEARS AGO 22nd September 2012

Sale made a quick start to the 2012 Grand Final with three goals on the board before Maffra had scored. The second, by Justin McLay was a clever interception of a Maffra handpass and the third, by Kane Martin saw him taken to the goal line courtesy of a 50 metre penalty. Maffra was struggling, Alex Carr snapping truly just minutes from the quarter time siren for the Eagles only major – Sale ahead by 13 points at the break. Again Sale struck early with goals to Brendan Rathnow, Kane Fraser and Matt Ferguson taking the Magpies to a thirty point lead just nine minutes into the term. Maffra fought back with the next three goals, but a brace each to Justin Mitrevski and Matt Ferguson (his 3rd and 4th for the match) as the teams went goal-for-goal maintained the lead at 22 points at half time. Shane Fyfe and Justin Dessent were leading a solid Sale backline, while the best for the Eagles were Gary Jones and Hayden Burgiel. The game was as good as over by three quarter time as Sale added a further five goals to one to lead by 43 points, a rather lacklustre final term seeing the eventual winning margin 56 points. Maffra scored

just four behinds after the ten minute mark of the third term. Kane Martin of Sale was awarded both the Stan Aitken Medal and the VCFL Medal.

20 YEARS AGO 21st September 2002

All associated with the Maffra Football Club were ecstatic when the Eagles claimed their first Senior premiership since 1948 with a hard fought 15-point win over Wonthaggi. Little did they know that this was the dawn of Maffra's Golden Age. The match started brightly, Wonthaggi's Chris Day kicking two clever goals to get the Blues the early lead. It wasn't until the 12 minute mark that Maffra's first goal came, courtesy of some determined work from big man Justin Bramich. This sparked Maffra, three goals following this to take Maffra in to the quarter time break with an 18-point lead. Maffra had the better of the field play, but inaccuracy in front of goal was preventing them converting this into a match winning lead. At half time they had double Wonthaggi's scoring shots, but led by just 14 points. The pressure was high in the third term, Tim Hooper scoring first for Wonthaggi to bring the difference back to nine points. Gary Jones replied for Maffra, then goals to Steve and Paul Brosnan saw Maffra's lead cut to two points. Nick Horsford extended Maffra's lead, only to see Tim Hooper score late in the quarter. Maffra had the chance to put the game beyond doubt, but once again couldn't find the major opening, until Nigel Sellings, then Gary Jones, again opened up the lead for Maffra. Steve Brosnan replied for Wonthaggi, and Tim Hooper kicked his fourth late in the term, but Maffra was "home" by fifteen points. Chris Pleydell won both the VCFL and Stan Aitken Medals, a great effort seeing that he had had injury concerns in the week leading up to the Grand Final.

30 YEARS AGO 19th September 1992

Traralgon's 1992 Premiership win was as emphatic as any ever played. Right from the start the Maroons were in control, inaccuracy preventing their lead from being far in excess of the 24 point advantage that they took to their quarter time huddle. Greg Morley was particularly busy in this first term. Geoff Hocking was dominant in the ruck for Traralgon, ensuring players such as best afield Neil Mildenhall, Jim Stevenson, Tony Lane and Morley had a constant supply of opportunities. Coach Geoff "Joffa" Cunningham also led by example, as Traralgon set about constructing a winning lead. Traralgon led by 41 points at the half way mark, this

extended to an insurmountable 74 points at the final break. Such was the machine-like discipline of this Traralgon team they piled it on in the final term, adding a further eight goals and kept the Magpies to just two behinds. It capped a remarkable day for the club as they won both the Reserves and Under 18 premierships. It also marked a "threepeat" for the Seniors as they had already claimed the 1990 and 1991 flags.

40 YEARS AGO 18th September 1982

Leongatha stamped themselves as the dominant team of the LVFL with their third flag in six seasons when they won the premiership with a margin of 34 points. A huge crowd on hand saw the league record a record gate for the Grand Final as well as the finals series. The match opened with scoring at a premium, the Gulls scoring the first goal (Caddy) and the Parrots just three behinds in the first ten minutes of play. Rob Ballingall was his usual busy self and Len Petch was winning in the ruck, but Warragul couldn't turn this to their advantage, Leongatha going to quarter time leading by 1.8. Warragul took the lead shortly into the second quarter. In fact the Gulls kicked 4.1 for the term before Leongatha added to their score, John Caddy's strong mark and goal sparking this mini spree. Despite this, Leongatha was only ten points down and they responded with goals to Collins and two to Wayne Lynch to go in to half time eight points ahead. A tense opening to the third term broke with Caddy scoring again for Warragul to which Graeme Salmon and Wayne Fowles answered for Leongatha. Rain then hit the match, making scoring more difficult, the Parrots heading to three quarter time with an eighteen point lead. The intensity hit new highs as the final term got under way and it was little surprise to those in attendance when a huge melee broke out. Leongatha settled the quicker and scored two quick goals to extend their lead to thirty points, Graeme Salmon sealing the match with the last goal of the day.

50 YEARS AGO 16th September 1972

In one of the most sensational finishes to a Grand Final in this league, Moe lost what an hour and a half earlier had seemed to be the unlosable match. Barry Bowe, with no more than twenty seconds left on the clock, kicked a goal for Traralgon with a snap from twenty metres out that took the Maroons to a one point lead. Moe had blown the game wide open in the second quarter, champion full forward Ian Jennings in great form with seven goals for the match. The Lions kicked 8.3 to 3.5 in the term to take

a half time lead of 34 points. While 34 points is not a sure thing, the way the Lions dismantled Traralgon's backline and had dominated the midfield led spectators to believe that more would be on the way in the second half. Traralgon set about chipping away at their deficit. Although "team effort" was listed as their best, Traralgon's midfield lifted, with centremen Brian Hammond asserting himself along with ruck-rover Charlie Healey. Hammond capped his game with four invaluable goals. Forwards in Bowe and Terry Hunter lifted as did those around them. Their third term realised 5.6 to Moe's single goal, the margin just four points. Moe struck first in the final term, and it looked as though their resurgence would get them home until Bowe's moment of glory got Traralgon home. After Moe's last flag in 1967, they had been well beaten in the 1968 Grand Final and then lost by three points to Leongatha in 1970 in another game that they had led early. They would go on to lose the next two Grand Finals narrowly, again by one point to Sale in 1973 and by four points to Warragul in 1974, earning them the title of "Collingwood of the Bush".

60 YEARS AGO 6th October 1962

If you've ever asked which team in this league has a perfect Grand Final record, the answer is Trafalgar. The Bloods contested two Grand Finals, 1958 and 1962, winning them both. Another quirk involving Trafalgar is the fact that they played six finals matches in their time in the LVFL (1954–1968). All six of their finals matches were played against Traralgon, Trafalgar winning four (2nd Semis and Grand Finals of 1958 and 1962) and losing both 1st Semi-Finals of 1957 and 1959. The 1962 Grand Final was postponed for a week, heavy rainfall having made the grounds unsuitable for the big game. There was never much between the two teams, Trafalgar's big men in Bill Milroy and 17 year-old Trevor Somerville giving Trafalgar an advantage at the stoppages. Trafalgar's key to stopping the talented Traralgon forward line saw great games from half backs in Graeme Chappell and Eric Webster, well backed by back pocket Frank Powell. The Bloods led at the two first change of ends, however Traralgon fought to a one point lead at three quarter time. Some players could be kept quiet for a whole game, but the mercurial Frank Munro wasn't one of those. Munro helped spark Traralgon with four goals of his own to be named as best for the Maroons. The final quarter saw Trafalgar at their best, kicking away with five goals to one, multi-talented sportsman Alan Rankin (also one of Gippsland's best ever cricketers) kicking four goals for the match to lead the scoring for the premiers.

Notes: Leongatha and Sale meet today for the very first time in a Senior Grand Final. The closest they've come to facing each other in the "Big Dance" is five Preliminary Finals, the first in 1973 and

the latest in 2003. More recently they have contested the Qualifying Finals of 2018 and 2019. Today is just the third time that these teams have played each other at the Ted Summerton Reserve, the other clashes at this venue occurring in 1974 and 2004. Both Leongatha and Sale currently boast ten Senior Premierships in this competition, the teams sitting second and third on the premiership table behind Traralgon on 20. Leongatha's current winning streak goes back to Round 3 last year, a run now of 27 consecutive victories, making it the equal third longest winning run in league history. Leongatha has won its last five games against Sale, although their most recent match, in Round 11 this year, would have pleased Magpie supporters in that Sale ran Leongatha right to the final siren. The Parrots got off to a good start to lead by almost four goals at quarter time only to see Sale peg them back to a two point margin at the final change. Although Leongatha went on to win by 18 points, their sharp shooting (13.4.82) went a long way to achieving this win. It's often said that momentum plays a big part come finals time, and Sale now has that in spades, battle hardened with well-earned wins over top quality sides in Traralgon and Wonthaggi. Have the two "bye" weekends freshened up Leongatha, or will they go in a little cold? Being the top side in the Final Five format is seen by some as a disadvantage in that a top side that wins its 2nd Semi-Final goes in to the Grand Final having played just one game in a month. What is ensured, though, is that a massive crowd will gather at Moe for what promises to be another epic battle in what has been in 2022 a Finals Series to remember.
