Week two of finals is here and we get the first glimpse at our top seeds in action. Ted Summerton Reserve plays host as the undefeated Leongatha senior football side and undefeated Morwell A Grade netball team set to begin their finals campaigns in the quest to complete rare feats as premiers and champions. Leongatha feature in both the senior and reserves football and the A Grade and B Grade netball which is an amazing achievement already by one of the powerhouse clubs of the Gippsland League. Maffra feature in three grades of football after their reserves and fourths won through the qualifying final last weekend to join their thirds side. The junior netball is dominated by Sale and Traralgon which feature in all three of the junior grades. It is set to be another amazing day of Gippsland League action as 10 clubs will win through to the first Grand Finals since 2019.

On Sunday we have another huge lineup that is split between the majority of our member clubs. We have another chance to set a record gate with the split of clubs including 7 different football sides with Sale,


Traralgon, Wonthaggi, Drouin, Bairnsdale, Leongatha and Warragul all competing. Sale and Traralgon headline action in the seniors in what is a true 50/50 game. Honors have been split this year between the two sides in even contests across the board. Both sides started off hot last week and will want to do the same again. It's do or die and we can't wait to see how it turns out. In the netball Wonthaggi and Moe headline action in the A Grade, the Lions will be hoping they get back coach Ramayer Gourley as they were well beaten without her in the Qualifying Final. The Power comfortably won this meeting in Round 18 but Moe may have some personnel changes coming in. Wonthaggi were tough and resilient against Traralgon on the Maroons home court last week and if they can show that same fight may see themselves in a preliminary final which would be a huge achievement from a team that was winless when the last full home and away season was played. Fingers are crossed that the rain stays away and we can have another two amazing Gippsland League events.

FINALS WEEK 1 SUMMARY



Finals were back for the Alinta Energy Gippsland League and they were back with a bang. Two days of pristine weather presented as all ten member clubs had a netball and football team representing them in week one of the finals.

Both days produced record gates smashing previous records set in 2016 (Qualifying Final) and 2019 (Elimination Final). Sunday produced one of the best finals days in the recent history of the Gippsland League where over 2100 people were on hand to see arch rivals Traralgon and Morwell battle it out in the senior football. The day was one of the rare occasions where all ten clubs had a team competing with seven clubs (Traralgon, Morwell, Sale, Bairnsdale, Moe, Drouin and Leongatha) playing in the football matches and the other three, technically four including Drouin Netball Club, playing in the netball schedule. Wonthaggi Power made a return to A Grade finals for the first time since 2016. After going winless in 2019 it was an amazing turn around for the club which also had their senior football side win through to the 2nd Semi Final on Saturday.

Traralgon broke out to an early lead in the senior match and pilled on the first seven goals before Morwell responded. Kicking towards the majority of their supporter base at the southern end the Tigers clawed back into the match in the second term. Inaccuracy in front of goals in the third term cost them dearly as they had a chance to push for an unbelievable comeback. Late Maroons goals steadied the ship, and they took a 20 point lead into the final term. The Tigers wouldn't lie down and bought the match back to a single goal in the final term but late goals to Troy Forrest and Matt Northe sealed a famous Traralgon win by 18 points. In the netball, the Maroons had a reversal of fortunes as they were well beaten early. The Power were 10-2 up at one stage and were dominating play. As was the case in the football



the trailing side fought back and some nervous Wonthaggi plays late in the third saw the lead erode and the Maroons stepped up to take a two goal lead into the final change. The last quarter was played at an intensely high standard with bodies flying everywhere around the court, it was vintage Courtney Young as she was the difference in front of goals while Jess Blair and Zali Anderson provided vital turnovers to get the Power through to the Semis.

In the Saturday matches Wonthaggi was against on the card with the senior side lining up against Sale. The Magpies burst out of the blocks and took an early three goal lead. Once Wonthaggi got going they were irresistible. Troy Harley was the difference up forward kicking 7 goals while the Blair brothers dominated through the middle. Sale came back late with a few majors, but it was too late to influence the game. In the A Grade match the Lions were without their coach Ramayer Gourley who was on representative duties. The Parrots took full advantage of this and never gave the Lions team a chance. It was an incredibly professional performance as they notched up a 30-goal win.

5 YEARS AGO 9th & 10th September 2017

Both semi-finals of 2017 were clear cut victories set up in dominant first quarters. On Saturday at Morwell Leongatha jumped to a 16 point lead at the first break, then scored the only two goals of the second quarter, both coming from the boot of Jack Ginnane. With Ben Amberg winning in the ruck, Traralgon fought back in the third quarter, goals to Jay Neagle, Tim Northe and Rohan Hildebrand. Tom Marriott had goaled for the Parrots at the 4 minute mark of the term, and remarkably the margin in Leongatha's favour was just 14 points. Any chance of a late run from the Maroons was quickly snuffed out as Leongatha scored the first three goals of the final term, going on to record a 28 point win.

The 1st Semi-Final had to be moved from Warragul to Sale. Maffra had 21 inside 50s to Moe's 6 in the opening term, the Eagles scoring 3.6 to nil, Moe's first goal coming early in the second quarter. Daniel Risol's goal for the Lions just before half time brought back the deficit to 35 points. Mitch Bennett (6 goals) and Daniel Bedggood (5) were brilliant in Maffra's forward line as the Eagles won easily by 55 points.
