GAZETTE ROUND 1 WRAP UP



It wasn't a week for the scorers as the Gippsland League completed its first full round, with wet weather playing a role in most of the matches. Here's what you might have missed around the grounds.

Moe vs Morwell

A scrappy defensive effort has seen Moe take the points over local rivals Morwell.

In what was a low-scoring, highly contested affair both sides struggled to take their chances at times. In the end, however, the Lions reigned supreme with a 7.14 (56) to 7.5 (47) win.

The win was largely built off the back of Herculean efforts from tough-as-nails midfielders Riley Baldi and Ben Daniher, while twin towers Chris and Ben Prowse were equally as impressive around the ground.

Missing a plethora of names from last season and boasting some more youthful talent, the Lions still looked the more likely of the two sides through what was a war of attrition at times.

Trailing by 22 points at the final break, the Tigers came hard in the final term, dominating territory for most of the quarter as earlier injuries to Lions Ben Maslen and Luke Mulqueen had the home side tiring.

And while they managed three goals for the term, they simply couldn't find a consistent way through the brick wall of Moe coach Declan Keilty.

The Tigers were well-served by the likes of Zachary Anderson, Tom Gray and Tyler Hillier.

When the game was there to be won, however, they just couldn't take their chances.

With the Lions due to get some troops back next week, including star goalkicker Harry Pepper, they'll take these four points and move on.

Morwell's match against Bairnsdale next week now looks all the more interesting – both sides have finals aspirations, and it'll be a good early barometer for both teams.

Leongatha vs Traralgon

If bad kicking is bad football then Leongatha were spared a few blushes on Saturday as a hardly believable first half goalkicking performance couldn't stop the reigning premiers from claiming a tense win over Traralgon.

The Parrots failed to kick a goal in the first two quarters of their premiership defence, the scoreboard reading 0.10 to Traralgon's 3.4 as the teams went into the rooms.

As the rain teemed down, the home fans sitting in their cars at Parrot Park must have felt a sense of relief by the time they finally got to honk their horns when Cameron Olden marked and goaled eight minutes into the third term.

Leongatha had more than matched what the Maroons were throwing at them to that point, but without that scoreboard reward there was an upset brewing.

As it turned out, Olden's major released the pressure, the Parrots piling on four more goals for the term to take a six-point lead into the final term. Olden then kicked his second to open the fourth, before Maroon Luis D'Angelo matched it.

It was Traralgon's turn to miss out – the Maroons kicked three behinds after that goal to squander what could have been chances to steal the game. For a side tipped by some to slide, it's been a promising start to the year for Traralgon and a win here would have really stamped their authority. Instead, the competition's most feared side did what they know how to do better than anyone else – win.

Leongatha's best for the day were Jake van der Pligt, Olden, Sam Forrester and Jack Hume.

Traralgon were best served by Tye Hourigan, Max Jacobsen and Tom Hamilton.

Sale vs Maffra

The famed 'Battle of the Birds' saw Sale run away with a relatively comfortable victory over rivals Maffra on Saturday.

Breaking away from the weekend's trend of low-scoring games, the Magpies made their move with

a powerful second quarter statement, kicking eight goals to blow the game wide open and run away 16.15 (111) to 12.7 (79) winners.

Though Maffra put up plenty of fight and even won the third term, the 35-point half time deficit was always going to be tough to overcome.

Bodhi Walker top-scored for the Magpies with four goals, while Thomas Campbell and, unexpectedly, Will Leslie booted three each. Not bad for a bloke who's kicked four goals total across the past two seasons.

The expected names led from the front for Sale, namely big man Jack Leslie and star Shannen Lange.

There was enough to like from the rebuilding Eagles. The first and third terms would have been especially pleasing, but as is the case with many young sides their lapses were severe enough for an experienced side like Sale to take advantage of.

Jett Killoran, James Read and Kade Renooy were their best.

Warragul vs Wonthaggi -

New season. New Gulls. Warragul has pulled off the upset of the round in their season opener, playing an outstanding wet weather game to shock last year's runners-up Wonthaggi by nine points.

The Gulls were simply ruthless at the contest and relentless with their pressure throughout the day in the 8.9 (57) to 7.6 (48) win to stamp their authority on season 2024 straight off the bat.

Dealing with some dour conditions, the game was hardly the most appealing to the eye as both sides made mistakes. But in wet weather territory is king, and that's exactly where the Gulls won decisively.

The return of ruckman Mitch Smart, who spent all of last year injured, paid dividends immediately, the big man putting it to his players on a silver platter while also marking strongly around the ground.

New recruits Jack Lewsey and Isaac Wallace were ferocious around the ball, teaming up with human wrecking ball Tom Hobbs to form a combination to leave Wonthaggi searching for answers.

Young Tom Stern (two goals) stood up in the forward line, crashing packs and providing an

important target. Stern could have finished with a few more goals if not for some errant set shots and a couple of questionable dribble kicks late in the game.

Warragul's backline also was immense, clamping down effectively to leave the Power's forwards with little to no space. Sean Masterson was especially prolific, teaming up with Patrick Mulqueen to keep the dynamic Cooper McInnes to little influence when the game was on the line.

While the Gulls were clearly up for the fight in the first half, their finishing going inside 50 and around the goals left a lot to be desired, forcing them to settle for just two goals – both from free kicks.

And when Wonthaggi kicked the first goal of the second half following a silly 50m penalty given away by Hobbs, the Power looked as if they were going to break the game open by taking their chances.

But the Gulls' dominance around the stoppages held them in good stead and began to pay off.

Warragul dominated forward half territory for most of the third term, as consecutive goals to Bayley Paul (who finished with three for the day), Stern, Hobbs and Paul again had them heading into three quarter time 14 points up and had the red and black crowd roaring.

Coach Jed Lamb revved his side up one final time at three quarter time, telling them that their mission to create a winning culture began now.

Things got off to a shaky start in the last when McInnes ran in the first goal minutes in.

Despite that, the home side steadied after a shanked set shot from recruit Thomas Crole was marked strongly by Stern, who kicked truly to restore the buffer.

Stern could have had another, or even two more, when twice he found space out the back running inside 50.

However, in what was a rather bizarre choice, both times he chose to dribble kick the ball in the wet, missing out on a chance at goal in a way that would have had Jason Dunstall fuming.

Luckily for Stern his first attempt was soccered through by Wallace near the goal line, pushing the

Gulls' lead to beyond three goals and saving him a few blushes.

The Power pushed late, finally finding some space to work with, but two late goals had no effect on the result, the final siren sending the Warragul players into jubilant celebrations.

For their part Wonthaggi will be left smarting after a loss like this.

Last year's grand finalists were missing nine players from the team that fell to Leongatha in last year's decider. Regardless, there wouldn't have been many tipsters around the league who would have picked them to lose this one.

With names like Ryan Sparkes, Cooper McInnes and Toma Huther still in the side they boasted plenty of talent, but just looked off around the contest and struggled to break through the Gulls' pressure all day.

Their better players included Jack Blair, Jakeb Thomas, Sparkes and Huther.

It's been a long road for Warragul, whose 2023 season was utterly destroyed by injuries to just about every key player on their list.

Nothing cures an ailment in footy quite like a win, however. And with plenty of players – including Lamb – still yet to return from injury, suddenly things are looking a lot brighter for the Gulls.

The standard has been set. Now it's up to them to maintain it.

Bairnsdale vs Drouin -

It was a case of missed opportunities for Drouin as they kicked off their season in disappointing fashion with a defeat to Bairnsdale away from home.

The Hawks looked off the pace for vast stretches of the day, conceding the first four goals of the match and never being able to bridge the gap during the 6.13 (49) to 9.11 (65) loss.

That's not to say they didn't have their chances, however. The Hawks managed to generate, but failed to make the most of scoring shots that would have had the Redlegs sweating.

Too often they were drawn like bees to a honeypot, the Drouin midfielders being too eager to head

to the ball and leaving space on the outside for Bairnsdale to cut them up.

That's not to say the Hawks had no shining lights – recruits Ryan and Caleb Quirk put up strong efforts, Jordan Kingi was his reliable self and Tim Hancock provided a consistent contest in a forward line that needed it at times.

The opening period of the match was the worst for Drouin as Bairnsdale kicked four unanswered majors in the first half of the quarter to take a stranglehold on the contest early.

It wasn't until late in the term, after kicking six straight behinds, that Drouin finally struck back with consecutive goals to Eddie Morris and Benjamin Brasier to keep them in the hunt.

A relatively even second term still had the Hawks alive, but as is often the case in footy the missed opportunities came back to haunt them.

Bairnsdale, using the width of their home ground to great effect, kicked the first three goals of the second half to blow the margin beyond 30 points.

Lachlan Byrne-Jones and Brayden McCarrey (three goals each) proved to be the most dangerous Redlegs around goal in the absence of playing coach Logan Austin, who was injured during last week's season opener.

Recruits Tom Blenheim and Hugh Longbottom also showed plenty of class to suggest why the home side had sought them out during the offseason.

The Hawks managed to peg back the margin somewhat, but a wasteful final term (1.5) consigned them to a 16-point loss.

Drouin has made no secret of their desire to jump up the ladder in 2024, and it's games like this against other sides that didn't feature in finals last year that will likely decide what kind of jump, if any, they can make.

For them to lose this one will require a bit of a reset on their part. The Hawks next face the rebuilding Maffra at home this Saturday.

If they're serious about becoming better, it's a game they should, and some would say simply have to, win.

Dashing defender Dave Adams played his 200th senior game last weekend.

Coming through the Maffra junior system, Dave first tasted senior football way back in 2007 in what was his top age thirds year. His debut came in the Round 5 clash against Morwell and he held his spot for the remainder of the season. He became a premiership player in only his 17th game when the Eagles defeated arch rivals Sale in the Grand Final.

After playing every game in 2008, Dave tried his luck in the VFL with the Northern Bullants in 2009. He played a handful of games for the Eagles early in the season and returned to the line-up for the finals. With his VFL experience and fitness he was a valuable player in the heart stopping after-the-siren grand final victory over Traralgon. In 2010, Dave returned to the club in a full-time capacity. Playing every game for the season he claimed his third premiership in the decider against Drouin. The player reviews for the Grand Final stated that Dave was a "...hard running utility, capable of breaking the lines and creating opportunities for the forwards". These qualities were clearly on display when he kicked two early goals which contributed greatly to the end result.

After playing with Macleod in the Northern Football League in 2011-13, Dave returned to the nest in 2014. In 2016 he played his 100th senior game and added a 4th premiership to his resume in the emotion-charged upset victory over Leongatha. Heartbreaking Grand Final losses followed in 2017 and 18. The 2018 loss was particularly galling for Dave as the Grand Final was his 150th senior game. However,

the bitter memories and disappointments of those two losses were erased in 2019. After managing just eight games in an injury-interrupted home and away season he returned for the finals and collected his 5th premiership medallion in the see sawing decider against Leongatha.

The 50 games from 150 to 200 have been a bit of a journey for Dave, with injuries and pandemic interruptions taking their toll. Ever reliable, Dave has been a cornerstone of the Maffra defence over the duration of his career thus far. His durability is a testament to his preparation and his overall fitness level. Over the years he has delighted the Maffra faithful, both with his close checking defensive and spoiling work and his pace and willingness to run through the lines.

With 28 finals for 19 wins and 9 losses and 5 premierships from 7 Grand Finals his CV will be further enhanced with automatic Life Membership of the club on reaching the 200-game milestone. Congratulations Dave and good luck for the rest of the season!

MENTAL HEALTH ROUND

'MAKE BETTER MENTAL HEALTH OUR GOAL'



The Alinta Energy Gippsland League will be hosting two core theme rounds in 2024 while also supporting club led themed matchdays. The Gippsland League will host the annual Loy Yang B Mental Health awareness round along with the annual Orange round initiative. This medal will be decided by the winning sides coaching panel and is awarded to the player they believe demonstrated the most courage, determination and teamwork for the winning side.

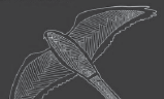
